- Co-ordinate the activities of projects and other personnel assigned to the projects.
- Participate in defining the project scope and requirements, and preparing specification documents through liaison with project sponsors.
- Lead in the development of procurement documents (e.g. RFI/RFP).
- Act as a consultant to project proponents/sponsors by providing technical and other advice, and assisting in feasibility studies, cost-benefit analysis, market research and proposed applications.
- Lead the project team in the evaluation of vendor bids and proposals.
- Negotiate and administer procurement and maintenance/support contracts.
- Prepare plans and schedules, track and report on progress and variance, and apply or recommend solutions.
- Ensure appropriate documentation of systems is in place, including operational procedures.

- A university degree in a computer or business-related discipline or equivalent, preferably with a Project Management Professional (PMP) Certification, or an equivalent combination of education and experience.
- A minimum of five (5) years' experience in information systems implementation.

- Demonstrated knowledge of appropriate computer hardware and software.
- Demonstrated knowledge of systems procurement practices and contracting.
- Demonstrated leadership and Project Management skills.
