The Director is a key contributor to the long-term strategic planning of construction and infrastructure management, preparing for the rapid and continuing growth of the UTM campus.

With a degree in architecture or engineering, the ideal candidate possesses at least 10 years of related experience and a proven track record in project management and design, building maintenance management, and construction supervision. They possess the ability to establish and maintain productive working relationships in complex and unionized environments, and have led and inspired teams to achieve their very best. Skilled at being the point-person on high profile projects and leading public consultations, the successful candidate will have experience procuring services. An understanding of LEED standards/certification for buildings is essential.
